

JUNE 2013 FROM CART

Survey of the front yard of Roysdon House is complete. The dark loam feature located near the Roysdon driveway that Kayla M was working on for the last few months has finally terminated at the red, clay subsoil consistent with the rest of the front yard.

The CART crew has now moved to the backyard of the Roysdon House. Kayla, Jonathan, and Megan are now working on units about seven meters apart right on the slope in the backyard. Jonathan is currently excavating two units to expose a dark stain feature containing a brick located below a fill layer. Some of the artifacts Jonathan has recovered include creamware, pearlware, and smoking pipe, all dating to the mid to late 18th century. An excavation unit near the gravel driveway has exposed large architectural stone and artifacts ranging from Mason jar fragments, milk glass, window pane fragments to porcelain sherds.

The Old Colchester Park and Preserve Open House was a complete success! Aside from the extremely hot weather, we had a great turn out of about 100 interested visitors. Christopher Sperling gave tours of the town site, showing our enthusiastic visitors the outline of the Morris Pound House and several other features found in the past couple years.



There was also a nature walk given by Fairfax County Park Authority naturalist, Charles Smith, showing our visitors some of the natural habitats of the plants and animals of OCPP.
