OLD COLCHESTER



After a little over a month of great weather and hard work, CART was able to complete the MTUs in the Flood Plain Survey. The survey consisted of testing the northern boundary of the large prehistoric site along the Occoquan River. Some of the artifacts uncovered ranged from historic nails to prehistoric lithics as well as small pieces of prehistoric pottery. The lithics consisted mainly of quartz but the team uncovered chert flakes as well. We would like to send out a thank you to the CART crew and the volunteers for all their hard work on this survey. In the picture, Jean and Jonathan are finishing up the last MTUs on the Flood Plain Survey.


CART would like to welcome George Mason University student interns to the team. While we will also be taking a number of GMU volunteers who are committing to 40 hours this semester, our four interns are committing to 120 hours of work in order to better learn the skills they will need as they pursue opportunities within the field of archaeology. As you might recall, Colchester was first intensively investigated by George Mason University in the 1980s, well before most of our interns were born!

Marion, our GIS specialist, has been working hard on in integrating archaeological data and historical data to create a õVirtual Colchesterö. The town of Colchester and some of the buildings, from around circa 1760, are overlaid on a modern terrain model. Seen in the middle of the image is the Morris Pound vineyard, and in the lower right are representations of the structures of which we found evidence on the Cemetery Site.
