OLD COLCHESTER By Megan Veness, CART

Cooler and wetter weather forced CART into the lab for a few days. Artifact washing, weighing and windowscreen soil picking are the variety of activities for staff and volunteers in the lab. Using the processed artifacts, reports from work at OCPP from the past three years are almost complete.

During the warmer November days a few units were excavated at the Old Colchester Park and Preserve. The northeastern corner and possibly the southeast corner of the brick structure was exposed. The bricks in the foundation are missing from the eastern wall. These could have been removed with the other bricks of the chimney and other courses of the foundation, when the structure was abandoned in the 1770s. White salt-glazed stoneware, flat window glass and wrought nails were recently found in the excavations.



In the lab this month CART staff have been working hard to wrap up a lot of loose ends on some of the smaller projects that we have worked on throughout the year including work on the Ash Grove Meathouse, and at Hidden Pond and Ellanor C. Lawrence Parks. This has meant refining our skills in lithic and faunal identification to ensure that all the artifacts have been properly identified, cataloged, and put into our database system. Then, our wonderful volunteers have been helping to weigh artifacts and affix labels onto them. We are getting these projects ready to be passed on to the Collections team for permanent curation.

CART members are working on their presentations for the Society of Historical Archaeology (SHA) Conference in January in Washington DC. Four CART members and two staff from Cultural Resource Management and Protection Branch are presenting on the archaeological and collections and happenings in Fairfax County. We also look forward to hearing other papers by other presenters about other archaeology finds from around the world.

A few times throughout the past month, staff and students from the Fairfax County Public Schools have come to the Old Colchester Park and Preserve to film about how history can be learned through objects. Students conducted interviews of the CART staff, and filmed excavations, waterscreening and dry screening. Learning history through objects connects the tools of today to other activities of the past.
