

CHAPMAN'S MILL AND THOROUGHFARE GAP

We began the shovel test pit (STP) sampling along the N100-foot baseline, completing N100E110 and N99E129 (the latter avoiding a tree) (see photo). We were limited in how many STPs we did by the need to train the crew and in getting a handle on both the equipment and soil changes.

We only were able to excavate the first three strata in STP N100E150, so I plan to return tomorrow to excavate stratum 4. Stratum 3 in the first two STPs was a mottled clay and loam with artifacts. The sub-soil (stratum 4) was uniform clay. In STP N100E150 strata 2 and 3 were completed.

However, in evaluating stratum 4 we encountered water rolled quartz cobbles and other redeposited rocks. That indicates stratum 4 in STP N100E150 may either cover or contain older cultural material. It is in a clayey matrix, which we did not have time to screen, so that will be tomorrow job.

Ann Wood recovered our first point, a quartz stemmed point fragment (attached) from stratum 3 in STP N100E110. The point is likely Woodland in age ó less than 3,000 years old. So far very few prehistoric artifacts have been observed, which is likely due to our starting at the west (upslope) end of the grid as we are working toward the adjacent floodplain.

However, a number of good historic artifacts have been observed. These include Chinese export porcelain, green shell edged white bodied earthenware, redware, stoneware, wrought and cut nails, and oyster shell.
