While in the lab, each of the field crew has a specific project they work on. These projects include cleaning/organizing the wet and dry lab to make for a more effective working space for both crew and volunteers, cataloging artifacts from previous projects, and photographing unique or representative artifacts from past excavations for digital preservation.

Our two-woman collections crew, Heather and Melissa have been working diligently on several projects to make the collections space more productive for Archaeology and Collections Branch research.

While our field techs have been helping in the lab, Crew Chief Colleen has been writing a report for a small two-day shovel test survey project that was recently completed. Writing a report for an archaeological project involves detailed descriptions on the site and its history, the field work that was done by the crew, and the use of digital mapping programs. She has been using a software called AutoCAD to make digitized site profiles.
