

#### Fairfax County Archaeological Research Team

As the holiday season approaches CART is taking time to wrap up multiple projects worked on throughout the year. There is not much field work to speak of right now but the team is hard at work researching and writing up previous excavations and preparing for future projects. Our Lab director and assistant lab director continue to work incredibly hard processing and cataloging the massive number of artifacts brought into the lab this year. Their work is vital to the completion of reports and understanding the broader view of these projects.

This month in acknowledgement of Veterans Day, CART posted a brief history of the military companies of the 304<sup>th</sup> Engineering Brigade 79<sup>th</sup>

Division that made camp on the ground of Mt. Air in 1918 while they built a railroad spur connecting Accotink Station to Camp Humphreys (today& Fort Belvoir). The camp was nicknamed õCamp Merry Widowö in honor of the widow Mrs. George Kernan who owned the property.
