SMALLPOX INNOCULATION AND BRITISH NAVAL INVASION: ALEXANDRIA IN THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION

General George Washington ordered all soldiers to receive smallpox inoculation. Dr. William Rickman set up a field hospital at Jones Point south of Alexandria in 1777, to process all soldiers coming through the area from the south towards New York. Things went wrong, really wrong.

In April 1781, British warships sailed to Alexandria in search of General Lafayette to keep him from coming to Yorktown. These warships threatened Alexandria, the Maryland shoreline, and Mount Vernon.
